3:10 - the king gives Haman his ring	8:2 - the king gives Mordecai the same ring
3:12 - Haman summons the king's scribes	8:9 - Mordecai summons the kings scribes
3-12 - letters written, sealed with ring	8:10 - letters written, sealed with the same ring
3:13 -the Jews, even women and children to be killed on one day	8:11-the enemies, even women and children, to be killed on the one day
3:14- Haman's decree publicly displayed as law	8:13 - Mordecai's decree publicly displayed as law
3:15 - couriers go out in haste	8:14 - couriers go out in haste
3:15 - the city of Susa is bewildered	8:15 - the city of Susa rejoices
4:1- Mordecai wears sackcloth and ashes	8:15 - Mordecai wears the royal robes
4:1- Mordecai goes through the city crying	6:11- Mordecai led through the city in honour
